Opportunity: Showcase your music at MnSpin

Recently I was contacted for MnSpin by Jeff Radford, the Music/Art Librarian for the Hennepin County Library. MnSpin is specifically looking for Classical artists to submit recorded samples of their work. If accepted, these artists will receive a two-year contract and fee for their submissions. The submission period will start on February 21st and be open for one month. Musicians must live in Minnesota. I encourage you to investigate this opportunity.

What is MnSpin?

MnSpin's mission is to showcase Minnesota musicians through downloading and streaming their music from the MnSpin website. They want to connect the Library with the local music community and expand their patron base, as well as provide financial support to our artists by paving them for their music. Radford says, "A major focus of MnSpin is highlighting the diversity of the Minnesota music scene. but our last round didn't include too many musicians working in some of our genres, such as Classical and the many sub-genres within. I'm looking for additional artists to participate, as well as new contacts to expand our network."

Last summer they had over 325 submissions for the first round. These submissions were curated by a team including JD Steele, Maria Jette and Jessica Rau from the Cedar Cultural

Center. In early December the site launched with 55 artists. MnSpin is funded by the Friends of Hennepin County Library and will be starting this year's submission period on Feb. 21st. 

Mezzo-soprano April Hanson, featured in Thursday Musical's April 12th Morning Concert Series, holds degrees from Concordia College Moorhead and the University of Minnesota (M.M.) and has appeared in a wide variety of roles with the U of M Opera, Skylark Opera, the Gilbert and Sullivan Light Opera Company, as well as in oratorio performances and at the Minnesota Fringe Festival. April also works as a project manager in software implementation for Minneapolis Community and Technical College. April and her husband performed in last fall's St. Paul Art Crawl, and April will collaborate with a writer and a visual artist for another performance in this spring's Art Crawl (April 27-29). In 2017, April joined the board of Women's Art Resources of MN (WARM).

Artu Duo - Ruth Marshall, cello and Garret Ross, piano - will perform on the April 26th Morning Concert Series. The duo first met in 2009 at the International Festival-Institute at Round Top (Texas) and began performing together in 2011. Residencies at the Banff Centre in Canada and the Aldeburgh Festival in England followed, and since 2012 they have been the ensemble-in-residence at the Apollo Music Festival in Houston, Minnesota, which Garret founded and where he serves as the Artistic Director.

In 2016, Artu Duo made their New York debut at the Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall.

Ruth is a member of the Mill City String Quartet and principal cello of the Illinois Symphony Orchestra, and is a dedicated teacher as well. She holds degrees from the University of Washington and DePaul University and will soon complete yoga teacher training, with a special interest in teaching yoga to musicians. In her spare time, Ruth enjoys crosscountry skiing, knitting, and traveling with her husband.

In addition to his work as a soloist, chamber musician and teacher, Garret is a doctoral student in piano at the University of Minnesota. He currently teaches at the Cyprus Music School in Burnsville and maintains a large private studio in Minneapolis. He attended NYU's Steinhardt School, the University of Minnesota, and Bethel University and has performed in a variety of festivals, competitions, and master classes. In his spare time, he enjoys climbing, running, hiking, cooking and reading.



Yes, even I, at the tail end of Generation X, find it challenging to be in constant contact with the virtual world-especially when this constant contact sometimes heightens a feeling of disconnection.


