They chose the name of "Riverside Trio" because of their history and roots at the University of Minnesota. Later they played together as members of the Young Musicians of Minnesota (YMM) performing at Orchestra Hall on April 15, 2016 for a YMM preconcert performance in the Target Atrium. They would love to expand their reach into the community. YMM is an organization I was not familiar with, but I was struck by how similar its goals are to Thursday Musical's. Here's from their web page:

Fostering music students of all ages, the Young Musicians of Minnesota have partnered with the Minnesota Orchestral Association to serve the community and advocate the importance of having classical music in our state. To fulfill this mission, YMM inspires its members to grow in their artistic appreciation by supplying them with a variety of free opportunities such as music and outreach programs, volunteering, and performing.

Rachel Kilgore received a B.M. in Flute Performance from the University of Northwestern, St. Paul where she was chosen to perform a solo with the orchestra. She teaches privately through Northwestern's Academy of Music and frequently subs with several local area civic orchestras.

**Grant Johnson** is a student at the University of Minnesota where he serves as concertmaster for the Maroon Festival Orchestra and associate concertmaster for the Gold Chamber Orchestra. He is a Vice President of YMM. He also studies organ, and has been a featured performer in the Twin Cities American Guild of Organists member recital.

Arianna Wegley is studying Cello Performance with Tanya Remenikova at the University of Minnesota School of Music and a member of the University Symphony. She has participated in performances through the Schubert Club, Thursday Musical, and The St. Paul Chamber Orchestra Youth Chamber Music Competition.

Our last newest member is flutist **Zixuan Yan** who is pursuing her Master of Music at the University of Minnesota. A native of China, she is studying with Immanuel Davis and performs with the University Orchestra and Wind Ensemble.

# Community Concerts Explore New Venues and Visit Old Favorites

As we wind down to the end of Thursday Musical's 2016-2017 season, the Community Concert series offer two spectacular venues in which to savor the artistry of our fine musicians.

This spring, we have the honor of presenting a concert in a new venue, the First Congregational Church of Minnesota, located at 500 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue Southeast in Minneapolis. The history of the church is long, founded in 1851, and the church building, erected in 1886, is now on the National Register of Historic Places. Built of red sandstone in the Gothic-Romanesque style, its sanctuary provides a spacious and warm environment for musical performance.

Music is very important to First Church. In addition to its choir, instrumental music is often a notable part of its services, and children are invited to participate in musical activities each Sunday. The church has recently launched its own concert series, First@First, which presents concerts on the first Sunday evening of each month.

The Thursday Musical Community Concert will take place on Sunday, April 2 at 7:00 PM, and will feature pianist Jim Reilly performing solo piano works he has recently composed, along with a set of piano pieces by Gabriel Fauré. Mr. Reilly will also serve as collaborative pianist for mezzosoprano Suzanne Kennedy to complete the concert. Both artists on this program have connections to the First Congregational Church; Ms. Kennedy is a member of the congregation.

The Owatonna Arts Center, also historic, is a venue which has sustained a long partnership with Thursday Musical. The Owatonna Arts Center is located in the former Minnesota State Public School for Dependent and Neglected Children, an orphanage

which operated from 1886 until 1945. The building houses art galleries, a museum featuring artifacts from the orphanage, as well as a busy concert schedule presenting performers of all genres. If you have not yet taken in a concert in the O.A.C.'s performance space, you deserve to experience this treat of a venue. The room is bathed in the golden glow of two large stained glass windows, and offers two beautiful grand pianos along with a warmly resonant acoustic. Owatonna is only an hour's drive from the Twin Cities, a pleasant prospect for a springtime Sunday afternoon. Performers on this concert include Ilah Raleigh, whose rich soprano voice will fill your soul. She will be performing a program entitled "Celebrating African American Voices," songs by African American composer H. Leslie Adams with poetry by Langston Hughes, Georgia Douglas Johnson and other great African American poets. Ms. Raleigh's colleague at the St. Paul Conservatory for the Performing Arts, Michael Vasich, will collaborate at the piano. Filling out the concert is Gabriel Quenneville-Bélair, who has thrilled Thursday Musical audiences on many occasions with his stunning pianism. Mr. Quenneville-Bélair will perform works by Claude Debussy, Frédéric Chopin and David L. McIntyre. The concert is scheduled on Sunday, April 23 at 2:00 PM.

Franck was unaware that you can hear Cesar Franck's Prélude, Choral et Fugue for when his father became a naturalized French citizen, his piano, a cello Sonata by Bohuslav Martinu, and French sons counted as citizens only until they became 21 when Art Songs by **Bizet**, **Delibes**, and **Simons**.

One of the composers on this concert has a colorful and dramatic history. Cesar Franck was born in 1822 in Liege, a part of the United Kingdom of the Netherlands. His father was a Belgian bank clerk and his mother a young woman from Germany. Known as Cesar-Auguste So join us on March 2<sup>nd</sup> for our <u>first ever</u> Francophile pressure, there!) He was enrolled at the Royal -bas! Conservatory of Liege and studied solfege, piano, organ, and harmony.

In 1835, his father brought Cesar-Auguste and his younger brother to Paris to study at the Paris Conservatoire. The Conservatoire would not accept foreigners so Franck's father, Nicolas-Joseph was forced to seek French citizenship, which he was granted in 1837. At the conservatory, Franck began studies on the organ. For reasons unknown, he made a "voluntary retirement" from the Conservatory in 1842. Some suggest that it was his grueling schedule of academic studies, teaching privately, and giving concerts and that this was due to the pressure his father placed on him. "It was a hard life for him ... and not made easier by the illtempered and even vindictive behavior of his father..."(from Cesar Franck by Leon Vallas, 1951.)

Franck found refuge in the family home of a piano student and friend whom he later fell in love with and proposed marriage. Franck's father forbade any betrothal and marriage, and in France at the time, by law a father of a son under the age of 25 could prevent his son from marrying. Franck was so upset he left his family home with only the things he could carry and moved into the home of the Desmousseaux family, the family of his young love. He continued to court her and in 1847 when he turned 25, he informed his father that he would marry her. Their wedding was to take place on February 22, 1848. That was the month of the Paris revolt. To get to the church, the party had to climb over the barricades set up by the revolutionaries with "the willing help of the insurgents who were massed behind this improvised fortification." (from Cesar Franck by Vincent dl'Indy, 1910.)

In 1872, Franck was nominated to take over the professor of organ post at the Paris Conservatoire. The Come hear works by French and French-inspired nomination exposed the embarrassing fact that they were obliged to declare their allegiance to France. Franck had unknowingly reverted to his birth nationality of Belgian. Franck began the naturalization process at once and his post at the Paris Conservatoire became recognized in 1873.

#### Newly Renovated Concert Salon to Host Spring Home Concert

One of our home concerts this spring will be held at the home of Thursday Musical members, Russell Dedrick and Polly Meyerding. Russell and Polly have added an exciting new concert space to their home in White Bear Township.

Their home recently went through a two-year renovation. The overall remodel stayed within the original footprint of the house. During the renovation, only four walls were left standing. Three of those walls, were used in the living room salon. To enhance acoustics, the architect created a 12-foot tall barrel vaulted ceiling and included a rich hickory floor. The room also has wonderful architectural lighting and a beautiful fireplace with an antique mantel.

The grand piano in the salon belonged to Russell's grandmother. It is a Mehlin piano, built in 1910. It uses the same mechanism as a Steinway and was completely rebuilt by Ken Hannah of the east metro area. As you listen to the concert, sit back and enjoy the beautiful views of Bald Eagle Lake and even a 300-year-old cedar tree.

The Dedrick/Meyerding home concert will be held on April 20<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 a.m. Please come for coffee and conversation at 10:00. Other concerts on April 20<sup>th</sup> include a morning concert, at 10:30 a.m., at the home of Greg and Lisa Buck and an evening program, at 7:30 p.m., at the home of Sandra Haines.
