Steve Staruch, MPR, Living Concert Notes Moderator

Steve Staruch, a popular and engaging MPR host, will moderate the October 6 concert. On the program will be Amy Morris, flute and Mary Goetz, piano performing Malagigi the Sorcerer by Venezuelan-born composer Efrain Amaya and Tango Etude by Astor Piazzolla; the Başgöze - Pinto Piano Duo (Susana Pinto, piano and Pinar Başgöze, piano) will perform works by Brazilian composers Ernesto Nazareth, Zeguinha de Abre and Francisco Mignone; and clarinet trio (Janet Greene, Pat O'Keefe, and Nina Olsen) will be performing Eight Bagatelles by local composer Sarah Miller who has been teaching composition and piano at MacPhail Center for Music, Minneapolis, for seventeen years. Programs begin at 10:30 a.m. Arrive early and enjoy a preconcert reception starting at 9:30 a.m. Coffee and tea will be served from the official Thursday Musical silver service, an opening concert tradition dating back to the 1930's.

The October 27 concert will feature Bob Adney, percussion, violinist Dragan Stojković with pianist Mary Goetz performing Schumann *Violin Sonata No. 1*, and Flutespiration, a flute quartet with members Trudi Anderson, Mark Brudevold, Peggy Doerrie, and Sandra Sheih. Also on this concert is 2016 Young Artist Scholarship Competition winner Collin Jinks, piano.

So put away the bug spray and the lemonade, find your rakes and shovels, and settle in for another Minnesota fall and winter season. But don't forget that a wonderful line-up of Thursday Morning Artist Series concerts awaits you. Each program features amazing local artists who will delight and inspire you with their music. Sandra Saliny and Jean Krinke, will be performing piano music for four-hands at the home of Joni MacDonald on October 20.

Jean and Sandra met when they were both teaching piano and their children were in the Thursday Musical Young Artist Scholarship Competition.

Sandra's daughter, Susan, competed on the viola and her son, David, on the cello. Jean's son, Brian, competed multiple times on the violin and piano, winning his category in both instruments.

The beginning of their collaboration with piano duets began many years ago, as members of Thursday Musical and the

Minneapolis Music Teacher's Forum. They are currently members of both organizations. The duo will be performing Schubert's *Rondo in A major, Opus 107* on the Home Program. The *Rondo* is Shubert's final work for piano four hands, written five months before his death. The work begins with an *Allegretto quasi Andantino* that is tender and simple. The melodic line is developed into E major with the rondo theme transforming at the end into minor chords. Some say, this ending sounds as if touched by the hand of death.

The program also highlights Tim Perry on the cello, performing the *Cello Sonata No. 1* by Johannes Brahms, with Sue Ruby on piano.

William Beeman, bass, will sing selections from Cole Porter songs including pieces that were unpublished in the composer's lifetime. Jim Reilly will accompany on the piano.

Programs at the home of Pat Nortwen and Joni MacDonald begin at 10:30 a.m. with coffee and treats at 10:00 a.m. The evening program will be at the home of Mary Kirchner beginning at 7:30 p.m. Come early to enjoy coffee and friendship.



Thursday Musical's Community Concerts Partners with White Bear Center for the Arts

In addition to providing outreach to local assisted living centers in the form of beautiful music, Thursday Musical's Community Concerts also are hosted by community arts centers and churches featuring our fabulous artists in a performance series, and are all scheduled on the weekends!

Attending a Community Concert may lead you to a favorite get-away spot, or perhaps it will introduce you to a corner of the Twin Cities that you have not yet visited, or it might even be conveniently located in your very own neighborhood.

One of our newest such venues is the White Bear Center for the Arts in White Bear Lake. Founded in 1968, and inhabiting a brand new facility in 2013, its mission is to provide a gateway to diverse arts experiences.

The White Bear Center for the Arts features local and national artists in exhibition in its Ford Family Gallery, and offers a wide array of classes in visual arts as well as writing, cooking, and movement arts. By keeping its tuition prices low, it helps thousands of individuals per year participate in and experience the joys of the arts.

The concert at the White Bear Center for the Arts will take place on Saturday, October 29 at 4:00 p.m. in the bright and spacious Ford Family Gallery, and will feature soprano Debra Gilroy and L'Ensemble Autumno, a trio composed of violinist Elizabeth Ericksen, violist Stella Andersen, and cellist Faith Farr. A frequent performer with Thursday Musical, Ms. Gilroy will be singing an eclectic program including songs by Richard Wagner, Samuel Barber and Antonín Dvořák. Ensemble L'Autumno will perform Beethoven's buoyant *String Trio No. 1 in E-flat major, Op. 3*, a youthful work in six movements.

The White Bear Center for the Arts is easy to find at 4971 Long Avenue, the west side frontage road of Highway 61, and there is ample free parking in an adjacent lot.

Thursday Musical artists will also be appearing in concert at Walker Place in Minneapolis, Friendship Village of Bloomington and Summit Place Senior Living in Eden Prairie. Although the concerts at these venues are primarily for residents, they all offer some extra seating for Thursday Musical members who are interested in attending. Please do look in the *Events of Note* section to find dates and locations for all of our upcoming concerts.

Young Artist Scholarship Competition Applications Available November 1, 2016

The Young Artist Scholarship Competition will be held Saturday March 4, 2017 at St. Catherine University in St. Paul. Applications for the Young Artist Scholarship competition for 2016-2017 will be available and accepted starting November 1, 2016 at thursdaymusical.org/competition.

The competition categories are in Piano, Strings, Guitar, Woodwinds, Brass, and Voice. To be eligible, students must be studying with a private instructor and enrolled in grades 7-12, college, or graduate programs based in Minnesota, South Dakota, North Dakota, Wisconsin, or Iowa. Applicants in junior and senior high must also participate in one Young Artist Recital in either January or February 2017. The application fee is \$50 with a registration deadline of January 9, 2017. First place competition winners will be recognized with a featured concert performance on March 30, 2017 at MacPhail Center for Music, Minneapolis. Thursday Musical awards approximately \$20,000 in scholarships to winners in this competition.
