The Meadowlark String Quartet is comprised of violinists Hsin-Yin Min and Te-Chiang (Bacco) Liu violist Kirsti Petraborg, and cellist Lindsay Schlemmer. The Meadowlark Quartet performs in the Twin Cities as well as in Southwest Minnesota through traditional chamber music concerts and educational classroom concerts. Natives of Taiwan, Hsin-Yin Min and Te-Chiang Liu come to Minnesota by way of Boston Conservatory. All four members of the Quartet also play in the Southwest Minnesota Orchestra; Schlemmer and Petraborg serve on the

music faculty of Southwest Minnesota State University. The Quartet will be heard on the November 3rd Artist Series concert at MacPhail.

Pianist, Sarah Kang, holds degrees in Piano Performance from the University of Minnesota and Indiana University Bloomington. She is currently on the faculty at the MacPhail School of Music where she is a Suzuki Piano teacher. She finds particular joy in playing the music of Bach and Haydn.

Home Programs Delight in October

Luana Mitchell, soprano, delighted the audience at Pat Nortwen's home on October 20 with a movement from Mozart's *Marriage of Figaro*. *Als die Alte Mutter (Songs My Mother Taught Me)* from Dvorak's Gypsy Songs was also part of her performance.

Mark Brudevold performed Sonatina for Flute and Piano by Dvorak and also a more modern piece by Lennox Berkeley for flute and piano. Each of his pieces used a different flute, including a wooden flute which provided a folksy sound.

Salam Murtada, piano, performed two selections, including a set of pieces that he composed himself. These compositions were selected for performance at the Sydney Conservatory of Music during the College Music Society 2017 International Conference. "Atlal" and "Ghazal" are two movements from the four-movement Mu-Allagah Suite that Salam composed earlier this year. In this suite, the "Atlal" movement begins with a three-note motive that is freely varied in the manner of the ancient poetic verses. Two Levantine nomadic (Bedouin) folk melodies are quoted here, and developed in subsequent movements. "Ghazal" begins with a desolate ornamented gesture that becomes the first of several textural layers, like layers of wind, sand, and desert rock. An improvisatory cadenza of repeated notes mimics the traditional vocal ululations based on the well-known improvised folk motive, "ya leyli" ("oh, night!").

The evening of October 20 my husband and I along with about 12 other music lovers had the pleasure of attending a Thursday Musical Home Program at Mary Kirchner's residence. It was a wonderful time. I have always loved the idea of music being presented in the intimacy of someone's home. It's friendly and a bit more casual than performances in concert halls. There is something about ringing that doorbell, being greeted by someone who shows you where to hang your coat and entering a new space to see everyone. There is the time to mingle and chat over cheesecake, chocolate cake, a beautiful big bowl of fruit topped off with your choice of coffee or tea before and after the concert...as was the case at Mary's and then settling into a comfy chair or couch. Mary's beautiful grand piano graces a wonderful performing space with wooden floors, beautiful rugs and framed art work. Performers featured Pianist, Suzanne Greer, who played Haydn's Sonata No. 47 in B minor; Baritone, Mark Countryman and accompanist Steve Nordquist who performed Mélodie of Faure and Gounod, as well as Tosti and a Sammy Cahn folk song; Guitarist, Jon Wood, who performed Scarlatti and Bach and had serenaded us all before the program even began. All performers shared information about themselves and their music and composers – a bit like Living Concert Notes without the moderator. After the program we enjoyed chatting with each other over another sip or bite of something before saying thanks and goodbye only to grab our coats and head home. As we left I thought now that's a really fine way to spend an evening.

If you were not able to attend a Home Program in October, I hope that you make an effort to attend one of the 3 programs that will be offered on April 20. You will be glad you did!

Community Concerts: Thursday Musical Artists to Perform in Hastings, November 20

Thursday Musical's Community Concert series continues to bring our wonderful artists to venues all over the extended Twin Cities area. Throughout November and December, concerts will be presented at Carondelet Village in Saint Paul, Walker Place in Minneapolis, Catholic Eldercare in Northeast Minneapolis and at the Hastings Arts Center in Hastings, Minnesota.

The Hastings Arts Center has been a Community Concerts partner for many years now, and last season brought it to a new home when pianist Sarah Lockwood and her husband Travis purchased the historic Guardian Angels Catholic Church building in December of 2014. Originally built in 1868, the church was renovated to include a large performance space, an art gallery, and rooms for music lessons. Sarah began teaching piano, violin and viola lessons in the building shortly after purchase, and the Blessings Academy of Arts and Music held its official grand opening the following April. Eighteen months later, the school boasts ten instructors serving over 100 families with lessons on all the string, woodwind and brass instruments, piano, voice, guitar, and even bagpipes!


The center's concert hall was transformed in July of this year with the purchase of a beautifully restored Steinway B grand piano, originally dating from 1929. A dedication concert was given on October 1, including performances by Thursday Musical artists Gail Olszewski and Melyssa Rice, and the 2016-2017 concert series showcases performers of the local area, as well as national and international artists. The Thursday Musical Community Concert scheduled on November 20 will feature pianist Max Radloff playing works by Smetana and Schubert, as well as Mozart's heartfelt and exquisite Rondo in A Minor. Mary Kirchner will lend her rich mezzo-soprano voice to this concert as well, collaborating with pianist Jim Reilly to present four mélodies by Gabriel Fauré, two arias from La Pericole by Jacques Offenbach and three songs by Irving Berlin.

The website for the Hastings Arts Center and Blessings Academy, hastingsartscenter.org, will answer many of your questions regarding location, parking and other upcoming events. Sarah Lockwood has offered to give tours of the building to anyone who is interested.

A second Community Concert is open to Thursday Musical members at the Catholic Eldercare RiverVillage location in Northeast Minneapolis on December 4. Please note that this location has changed – the correct address is 2921 Randolph Street NE. The concert is being presented in conjunction with a tree-lighting ceremony, and can be a lovely way to kick off the holiday season. Pianist Suzanne Greer will be performing selections from Weihnachtsbaum (Christmas Tree) for solo piano by Franz Liszt. Weihnachtsbaum is a suite of twelve pieces that Liszt dedicated to his first grandchild Daniela von Bülow, daughter of Cosima and Hans von Bülow. Several of the pieces are based on Christmas carols, such as Adeste Fideles, O Holy Night!, In dulci jubilo, and others. Baritone Mark Countryman will fill out the concert, offering several seasonal songs, including an aria from Handel's Messiah.

Young Artist Scholarship Competition Now Open

Applications for the Young Artist Scholarship competition for 2016-2017 are available and accepted on the Thursday Musical website. Competition categories are in Piano, Strings, Guitar, Woodwinds, Brass, and Voice. Students enrolled in grades 7-12, college or graduate programs in Minnesota, South Dakota, North Dakota, Wisconsin, and Iowa are eligible. Students must be studying with a private instructor. The application fee is \$50, and the registration deadline is January 9, 2017. Applicants in Junior and Senior High must participate in one of the Young Artist recitals in late January and early February 2017. Students should check for the date that will work best for their schedule. The official competition for all applicants will be held Saturday, March 4, 2017 at St. Catherine University in St. Paul. Thursday Musical awards approximately \$20,000 in scholarships to winners in this competition. First place winners are recognized with a featured concert performance on March 30, 2017 at MacPhail Center for Music in Minneapolis.
